



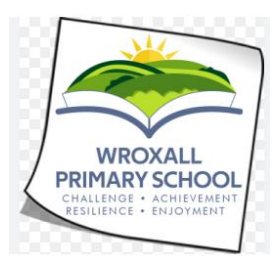







Turing Class – How you can help your chids learning...

<p>SPAG (spelling, punctuation and grammar)</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Encourage children to spell words for a shopping list • When reading, discuss the punctuation marks and how they change the way you read: Pausing, changing the expression for dialogue... • Point out grammatical features in reading and in the environment - question marks, exclamation marks etc
<p>Writing</p> 	<p>Generally, checking that when your child writes, they are using capital letters and full stops correctly to demarcate sentences.</p> <p>Encourage writing EVERYWHERE and for a a range of purposes -</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Letters and cards to friends and family • Shopping lists • Stories • Instructions
<p>Maths</p> 	<p>It's really important that your child knows their numbers -</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • write them, • read them, • make quantities to match the numerals • Play games which involve + and - and x • Children should know their 2, 5, 10 timetables and be able to count forwards and backwards. <p>They MUST be confident in Number Bonds to at least 20, 12 + 8 = 20 6 + 14 = 20</p>
<p>Reading</p> 	<p>Reading at least three times a week with your child will really help with developing their word recognition.</p> <p>Sometimes they will benefit from reading the same passage several times in the week.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Read the information on the inside cover - in colour-banded books, this gives you the sounds the books are focusing on and will aid their deciphering of unknown words. • Encourage them to read labels and signs, letter and, when watching TV, sometimes have the subtitles on so they can read along.

<p>Topic work</p>   	<p>In our Local History learning, we will be finding out about Osborne House and why it is important to the IoW, what life was like for both the royal family at the time and those who worked there as servants, cooks and footmen. Our visit on 23rd January will really help bring to life how life was in the 1800's.</p> <p>In Art, we will be looking at how those people who worked for others as slaves and servants, has been represented in art throughout the years, We will look at the colours that are used and compare these to colours in more positive images, We will discuss how the paintings make us feel and how the artists perceived the slaves differently to those who were wealthier.</p> <p>How we Hear Sounds is our theme for learning in Science. We are exploring sound and vibrations and setting up our own simple investigations to understand what happens when the vibration is stronger and the volume louder. We will be looking at the inner and outer ear and naming the organs within them.</p>
