Writing across the school

We have been working really hard through teaching and learning to develop writing skills across the school and this will continue to be a priority for development. However there are some quality skills developing across the school...

This week I am publishing on here a piece of work by a Y5 pupil. I wonder if you feel like you are in the rainforest like I did, when I heard the language used...

The amazon, you have arrived. You take a step into the haven. The croaks, growls and howls. The clammy heat swallows you up. You emerge under a canopy of bright, gargantuan of towering leaves. You see a purple frog hop over a stream of fast flowing water. Something tickles your cheek. You swirl around. It was the monkeys, who were chittering up in the trees, you see a flutter of blue and white. It's a butterfly.

You may think all the wonders of the rainforest lie in the animals. You'd be wrong. You turn and are blinded by a vast space of yellow, purple and pink. The plants! Nearby, a lily pad floated on the water. More flowers were dancing in the breeze. Their colours burst like fireworks. You are dazzled by their beauty. You see a beautiful hummingbird fluttering above you. The hummingbirds dance in a way you've never seen before, their wings flutter like a flame. You look u and see snaking green, strong vines...their SNAKES! You run to the river and see a greyish floating along... you jump. BIG mistake! You notice the log has a head. You realise it's a tamarind. You leap to the other side of the riverbank; cradled in a giant flower.

You turn to see a little village of hut homes and tribal people. They come up surrounding you. Curious about your adventurous clothes and weird hat and if you're a friend or foe. You get up and run until....

And it didn't stop here... what an amazing start to a piece of writing. A great stimulus book has been used to gather ideas to create the writing based on 'The Amazon Rainforest'.
